This roster is of the above men of Company H, 124th Regt, April, 1864. This identification was made by Lieut. John R. Hays, in 1910 and this reproduction was made from the original daguerreotype then in possession of Lieut. Hays (No. 2) in this picture.

Captain Crist was killed by a Confederate sharpshooter at Totpotomy, May 30, 1864. 1st Sergeant Thomas W. Bradley was promoted to 1st Lieut. to Captain, brevetted Major, U. S. V. Received the Congressional medal of honor. Wounded at Gettysburg, at the Wilderness; and at Boydton Road. He was mustered out June 3, 1865. Gouveneer M. Legg was wounded at the Wilderness. George Butters died a prisoner of war. Captured at Spottsylvania. William Henry Brown promoted to sergeant. Wounded at Chancellorville, at the Wilderness and Spottsylvania.
